NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

One of the highest honors a student in our school can achieve is to be selected as a member of the National Honor Society. Candidates are chosen on the basis of their leadership, service, character, and scholarship.

Eligibility Requirements

1. Students who have an average of 88% or above are candidates for induction. This average is calculated by using students' final grades for their previous subjects and the first quarter of their current grade.
2. A faculty committee evaluates bona fide candidates on the basis of information submitted to them about these students in regard to classroom performance, extra-curricular activities, and/or leadership and service activities. Members of the faculty committee are appointed by the principal.
3. Students in grades 7 – 9 are eligible for the JH Honor Society; students in grades 10 - 12 are eligible for the High School Honor Society
4. Students must maintain an 88% average each marking period. A warning will be issued the first time a student fails to do so. If at the end of the next marking period a member fails to achieve an 88% average, the case will be reviewed by the faculty council. If dismissal occurs, the student will not be eligible for membership again.
5. Members are subject to re-evaluation at the request of a faculty member. The request specifying the concern (character, leadership, or service) must be made in writing and submitted to the faculty committee for review.

STUDENT FUND-RAISING

All student-connected fund-raising organizations and activities are subject to the approval of the building principal.

The fund-raising activities of a club or class as a whole shall be limited so that they will not be an unreasonable burden on the community nor interfere with other worthwhile projects of the school. Fund-raising restrictions include minimizing door-to-door solicitations and limiting the number of fund-raisers any one group can sponsor.

SUBJECT: EXTRACLASSROOM ACTIVITIES FUNDS

An extraclassroom activity fund shall be established for activities conducted by students whose financial support is raised other than by taxation or through charges of the Board of Education.

All extraclassroom activities shall be approved by the Board of Education. The Building Principal shall maintain an up-to-date register of all extraclassroom activities that are approved or discontinued. Each extraclassroom activity shall have a faculty advisor appointed by the Building Principal. A Central Treasurer and a Faculty Auditor shall oversee all financial aspects of extraclassroom activities. The annual District audit will include all extraclassroom activity funds.

All extraclassroom activity funds shall be handled in accordance with the financial procedures illustrated by Finance Pamphlet No. 2, the Safeguarding, Accounting and Auditing of Extraclassroom Activity Funds, 2008, published by the New York State Education Department. All commitments and contracts shall be the sole responsibility of the extraclassroom activity club giving rise to the transaction, regardless of a change in advisors, membership or officers.

Proper books will be kept and all moneys deposited in appropriate accounts as set up by the Board of Education. These accounts shall be subject to audit. All transactions involving extraclassroom funds shall be on a cash basis and no accounts shall remain unpaid at the end of the school year. Funds shall be invested in accordance with the Board of Education's Fiscal Management Policy on the "Investment of District Funds".

The extraclassroom activities of the District are not included in the exemption granted to the School District from New York State sales tax. Without exception, clubs and activities are prohibited from using the school's tax exemption. The Central Treasurer shall be responsible for filing the periodic sales tax returns for the extraclassroom activity funds.

Funds of discontinued extraclassroom activities, those inactive for one (1) year and of graduating classes shall revert to the account of the general student organization or student council and shall be expended in accordance with the organization's constitution.

The Building Principals, with approval of the Superintendent of Schools, shall set up procedures for receipt and payment from the extraclassroom activity fund in their respective schools.

ATHLETIC AND COCURRICULAR PARTICIPATION POLICY

A student **must be in school** for the later half of the school day (by the end of the 4th period) before he/she will be permitted **to participate** in a practice session, interscholastic, extracurricular activity, or Driver Ed. **No exceptions will be made for illness**, although other valid excuses (e.g. college visits) will be considered.

A student's **eligibility to participate** in athletic and cocurricular activities **will be limited when he/she evidences an attendance or disciplinary problem**, since academic achievement is **the primary goal** of our school.

Any student who is seen by an Administrator for an attendance problem or discipline concern will be ineligible to participate in an athletic and/or cocurricular activity on that day.
